I-20 Request Form for F-1 Visa: MFA in Comics – Summer 2024

Congratulations on your admission to CCA! Now that you have been accepted, the next step is to fill out this I-20 Request Form and submit it in Workday, along with supporting documentation, so we can send you your CCA I-20. The following information is provided by the International Student Services (ISS) office. You may contact ISS with questions by email at <u>iss@cca.edu</u>.

What is a Form I-20 and why do you need one?

The Form I-20 is a U.S. government form issued by designated school officials at CCA. It states that the student named on the form has been accepted for a full-time course of study at CCA and that the school has reviewed financial documents needed to prove that the student has the financial means to live and study in the US. (Federal Regulation 8 C.F.R. § 214.3(k)(2); § 214.4(a)(1)(ix)). Getting an I-20 is a critical step in obtaining a F-1 student visa. Without an I-20, it is not possible to obtain a student visa or maintain lawful F-1 status in the U.S.

Submit your completed I-20 Request Form in Workday as soon as possible.

The ISS Office needs time to process your documents and issue your I-20, which you will need before making a visa appointment. To help ensure that you will be able to arrive in time for the start of your program at CCA, it is important to submit your I-20 Request Form as soon as possible. There can be long delays for visa appointments in the summer months.

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Please make sure to indicate which MFA Comics model you will enroll in at CCA. The ISS office cannot issue your I-20 without confirmation of your choice. See page 2 for detailed information on each model.

Special Information for MFA in Comics Students

The MFA in Comics program offers two models, one that has a full-time residency structure (72 unit program) and one that is low-residency (60 unit program).

Option 1: Full residency model:

Students enrolled in the 72 unit model will be considered full-time each summer with registration of 12 units. Students will continue in the program as full time students registering for a minimum of 9 units <u>each fall</u> and spring semester in addition to required full time summer sessions. Full time enrollment in fall and spring allows students includes the following benefits: ability to remain in the United States while maintaining valid F-1 nonimmigrant status, enrollment in the CCA student medical insurance plan, and post completion of degree benefits like Optional Practical Training (OPT).

Students in the full residency model will be required to submit only one I-20 request form for the full program length.

Option 2: Low residency model

Students enrolled in the 60 unit model will obtain an F-1 visa to participate in the summer intensive sessions only. Students in the low residency option will only be enrolled part-time each fall and spring semester, and cannot stay in the US in valid F-1 status between summer sessions.

Because students in the MFA in Comics program are only required to be in the U.S. for one-month sessions and each session is one year apart, students will be required to submit new financial documentation, and receive a new I-20 in order to attend the summer intensive session on campus at CCA. You will need to apply for a new I-20 for future summer intensive sessions.

Proof of Funding

In order to satisfy the immigration requirement that a student show proof of funding for one year of the degree program, students must list the sources of funding available to them and provide bank documents that show proof of those funds.

Acceptable Sources of Funding

- *Personal funds:* Students can use their own funds to either partially or fully support themselves. If you will use your personal funds, the bank statement must be for an account in your name.
- Sponsorship (family or other): It is very common for students to have one or more sponsors such as parents or close relatives. If someone other than you is sponsoring all or part of the cost of your education, you must submit bank documents. Each sponsor must fill out a Letter of Support (page 6)
- *Scholarships*: Awards may be used as a source of funds for the Form I-20. You must include an award letter from the private or government scholarship board stating how much money is to be given.

Requirements for Financial Documentation

• All financial support documentation must be in English or accompanied by an official English translation, with amounts listed in U.S. dollars. If amounts are not in U.S. dollars, documentation of the current exchange rate and currency conversion must be included.

- The funds must be currently deposited and readily available. If the funds will be frozen for a period of time after issuance of the bank statement, they must be unfrozen and available by the program start date
- There must be a specific account balance listed on the document. Documentation that gives a range or indication of the balance (e.g. "high five figures") will not be accepted. If a sponsor wishes to keep their bank balance or income private, bank documents must say that the account balance is "more than" an amount that is clearly specified.
- All funds must be currently accessible, liquid assets. Stocks, proof of income such as paystubs, etc... are NOT acceptable.
- Documents must have been issued within the last 4 months.

Required Funding Amounts

Federal regulations require all students applying for an F-1 visa to show proof of sufficient funding to support themselves during their program in the United States. Each student must show proof of funding that meets or exceeds the total listed below to cover the first year of expenses.

The amounts for living expenses and other costs listed below are standardized, minimum amounts. A student's actual expenses may vary. Tuition and fees are subject to change on a yearly basis. All full- time students are required to purchase the CCA medical insurance plan.

+++ The low residency program costs below reflect requirements for the <u>summer session only</u> for the sole purpose of being issued the I-20 to come to the US as a F-1 student for <u>the current summer only</u>. Additional tuition, fees, and other costs for fall and spring semesters are not included here.
